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THE BIBLE. ALIVE.

Over the past several weeks we've embarked on a journey of Bible discovery. For many of us the pages of God's Word sometimes seem confusing, distant, or hard to apply to everyday life. So we set out with the goal of learning how to observe, interpret, apply, and correlate the most powerful book in the world: the Bible. It is my hope and prayer that you found the Bible coming to life! But just in case there were some gaps in my teaching or your note-taking, you will find in this handout a summary of the basic toolbox for accurately studying and applying God's Word. Enjoy!

THE "WHY" QUESTION

Why should you and I study the Bible?

- ❖ Bible Study is essential to Spiritual Growth (Psa. 19:10; 1 Peter 2:2).
- Bible Study is essential to Spiritual Maturity (Heb. 5:11-14).
- Bible Study is essential to Spiritual Effectiveness (2 Tim. 3:16-17).

THE GOAL? LIFE CHANGE.

STEP 1: OBSERVATION.

What do I See? Seeing things as they really are...

"The parts always take on meaning in light of the whole." ~ Dr. Howard Hendricks

- Find the Key Terms.
- ♣ Discover the Structure.
- See the Literary Form.
- ♣ Feel the Atmosphere.

"We see but we don't observe."
"Seeing always precedes understanding."

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STEP 1: OBSERVATION. CONTINUED...

BASIC TOOLS FOR OBSERVATION:

These points will make the text come alive, bring understanding, and help you "slap on their sandals." Ask these questions of the text and list them:

- Context:
 - o Who?
 - o What?
 - o When?
 - o Where?
 - o Why?
 - o Wherefore?
- Structure:
 - Contrast ("but," "yet")
 - Condition ("if...then")
 - o Repetition ("by faith, by faith,")
 - o Basic grammar
 - Q/A
 - Cause/Effect ("therefore," "so," "in order that," "as a result," "then")
 - o Climax
 - Comparison ("like," "as")
 - Correlation ("as...so," "and")
 - Explanation or Reason ("because," "for")
 - Interchange of Scene
 - o Introduction or Summary
 - Pivot
 - Purpose ("that," "so that," "since," "because")
 - Specific to General

STEP 2: INTERPRETATION.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

Basic Tools of Interpretation:

- · Ask the right Questions.
- Find the Answers.
- Discover the Genre (type of literature)
- Determine the Context (setting).
- Know the Historical & Cultural Context:
 - o Political: Who's Ruling?
 - Geographical
 - Economic
 - Legal
 - o Agricultural
 - Military
 - Family Genealogical
- Integrate the pieces into a meaningful whole. What was the intended message to the original audience? What does this mean across all time (theological)?

WHAT'S THE CRY OF THE EXEGETE? "CONTEXT. CONTEXT. CONTEXT."

STEP 3: APPLICATION.

HOW DOES IT WORK? SO WHAT?

APPLICATION STEPS:

- What difference does it make?
- Make it clear, connecting, and compelling.
- State it as an imperative.
